

# Site Control Panel

The Site Control Panel is one of the configuration tools in myRT Mobile. It allows a user to add, edit and delete Sites. These Sites define what you want myRT Mobile to monitor.

**Note:** Prior to adding a new Site, you will want to copy and paste our tracking code into your mobile site pages.

# Site Control Panel

## What is a Site?

In myRT Mobile, a Site can be defined as

- A single domain

*e.g. – mysite.com*

- Multiple domains

*e.g. – mysite.com*

*m.mysite.com*

*mysite.mobi*

- A specific directory under a single or multiple domains

*e.g. – mysite.com/mobile*

*m.mysite.com/mobile*

*mysite.mobi/mobile*

# Site Control Panel

Here is an example of how you would add a single domain as a Site

**Note:** *It's not necessary to specify the protocol (i.e. – http, https). Once you are done, click on the **Create** button.*

# Site Control Panel

Here is an example of how you would add multiple domains as a Site

Additional URL: m.mysite.com

Mobile

The **Name Field** is where you would enter the Site Name that you use to identify this Site. It can be any combination of alpha-numeric characters.

To enter multiple domains, click on the **Add** link next to the Primary URL or Additional URL box.

# Site Control Panel

Here is an example of how you would add a specific directory under a domain(s) as a Site

New Site

Name: My Web Site

Primary URL: mysite.com

Additional URL: m.mysite.com (Remove, Add)

Directory: mobile/

Top Page:

Parameters:  None  All  Selected

Mobile

Just as before, first enter the **Name** and all applicable **Domains**.

In the **Directory Field**, enter the name of the specific directory that you want to track.

**Note:** You can only have one directory defined per Site. For a subdirectory, just add after the directory name (i.e. – mobile/fun/ )

# Site Control Panel

## What do I do with Parameters?

If your site pages have query parameters in their URL, then you can use the **Parameters** feature when adding or editing a site to specify how you want to handle them.

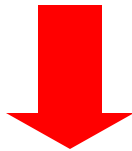
1. **None** – this option will remove any query parameters out of the URL string
2. **All** – this option preserves the entire URL string with all query parameters left intact
3. **Selected** – this option allows you to choose only specific parameters you want preserved and strips out all other query parameters

# Site Control Panel

Here is how some example URL strings are handled based on the **None** parameter option

- [mysite.com/mobile/?pid=456&cid=mob](http://mysite.com/mobile/?pid=456&cid=mob)
- [mysite.com/index.php?pid=789&cid=fun](http://mysite.com/index.php?pid=789&cid=fun)

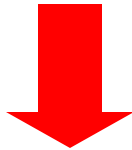
Choosing this parameter handling option removes all the query data in the URL and leaves only the whole directory and file name.

# Site Control Panel

Here is how some example URL strings are handled based on the **All** parameter option

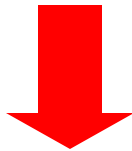
Choosing this parameter handling option preserves all the query data in the URL as is.

Choosing this parameter handling option lets you specify select query parameters. In this case we chose to preserve only the query parameter labeled “pid”.
